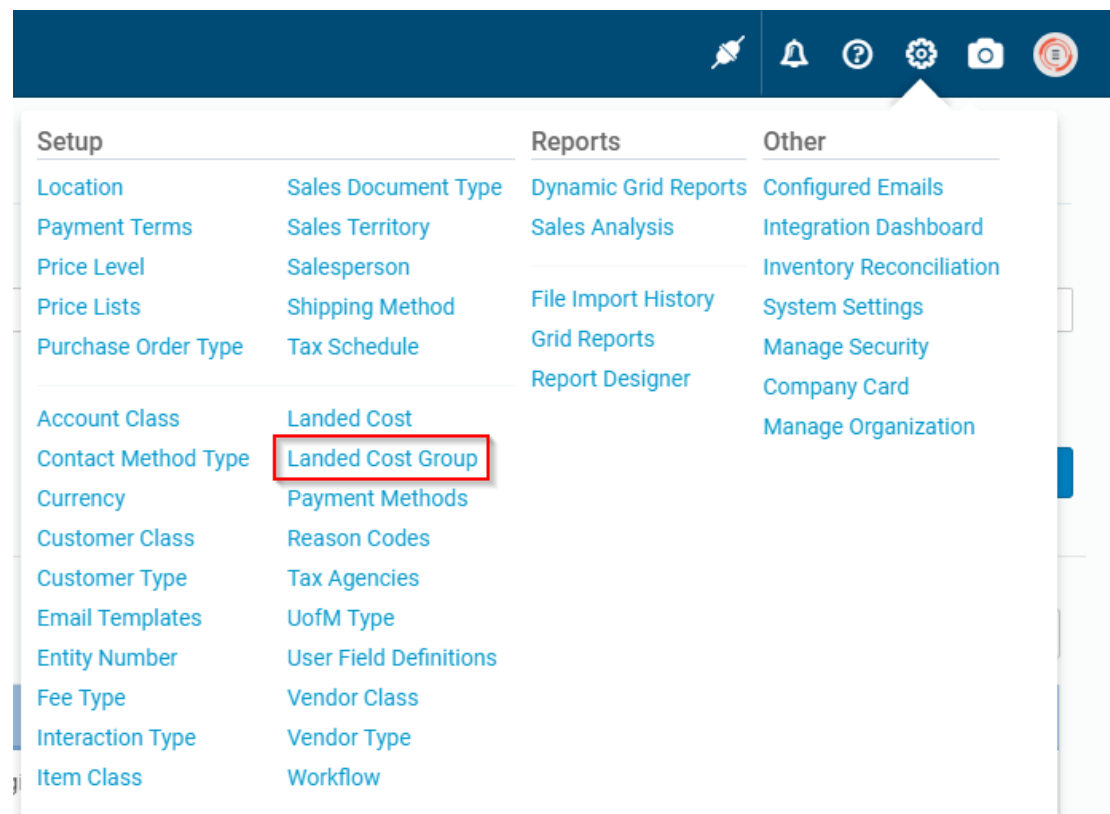

Overview

Landed Cost Groups allow you to group multiple [Landed Costs](#) together under one name. Landed Cost Groups can be added to Landed Cost tabs just like Landed Costs can.

To create a new Landed Cost Group, select **Create Landed Cost Group** in the upper left-hand corner of the screen.
